       All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,
       being justified as a gift by His grace
       through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus. (Romans 3:23-24, NASB)
       Remember that you were at that time separate from Christ,
       excluded from the people of Israel, and
       strangers to the covenants of the promise,
       having no hope and without God in the world.
       But now in Christ Jesus you who previously were far away
       have been brought near by the blood of Christ. (Ephesians 2:12-13, NASB)
