LEAD-IN: May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. (Galatians 6:14, NIV) OR:

LEAD-IN DEVOTIONAL READING:

Decide

I desire to do your will, O my God. (Psalm 40:8, NIV)
