       Salt was a required ingredient in temple offerings (Leviticus 2:13),
              enhancing flavor, preventing spoilage, and
              symbolizing enduring loyalty (note a "covenant of salt" in Numbers 18:19).
Salt flavors.
Salt disinfects.
Salt preserves.
Salt heals.
And it does so by interacting with what it treats.
       It gives itself and
             invests itself in
             the water, the elements on the skin, and the food.
